

Our Dear Friends,

Any gardener knows that garden weeds cause damage and need constant pulling up any time of the year including springtime.

Lent is an old Anglo-Saxon word meaning springtime, and springtime is the time when things grow, bad weeds as well as good plants.

The Bible warns us against a damaging weed called the weed of resentment with its bitter root. "Watch out that no bitterness takes root among you, for as it springs up it causes deep trouble." Hebrews 12.15. Then there is the weed of unbelief with its fatal root. Bitter, hard, angry, and irritated people can miss the grace of God and be excluded from the presence of the Lord. What terrible consequences from letting these weeds grow among us.

Many doctors would say that the poisonous emotions of bitterness and resentment can cause physical pain and suffering too.

The weedkiller for this vicious root is forgiveness, gallons and gallons of it (look up Ephesians 4 31-34 for example).

Forgiveness is not easy. Asking for forgiveness from someone and giving forgiveness to someone can be quite painful. The harsh realities of life give all of us the opportunity to experience this if we are courageous enough to accept the challenge. But it's easier to get angry, critical or bitter, and to keep someone at arms length than it is to sort out wrong realationships. Just as you have to squeeze an orange to extract its juice, or crush a flower to release its fragrance; so it is through the pressures and hurts in our relationships that the love of Jesus can be shown—provided we learn to forgive. We do not forget that Lent includes Good Friday when the Lord was crushed on the cross in order to make forgiveness from God a possibility.

In these present days many Christian people are asking themselves at least four personal questions. The first is, am I an honest person, do I always tell the truth ? It is easy to be loose with the truth and less than honest. The second is, have I been impure ? The question of purity is basic if this link in a chain of virtues is weak or broken, the character is marred. The third question is, have I allowed bitterness to take root in my life ? Of all the things that choke and poison the personality, bitterness is probably the most devastatingly effective. The fourth; is love the motive behind all my actions ? Romans 13.9 says, "If you love your neighbour, you will not want to harm or cheat him," and 1 Corinthians 14.1 says, "Let love be your greatest aim."

Our reaction to failure should not be despair but an honest prayer for forgiveness in a genuine spirit of repentance.

We do not have to wait for Lent to do a bit of self searching but since that is the present season in our calendar we shall be easier to live with if we take advantage of it.
