

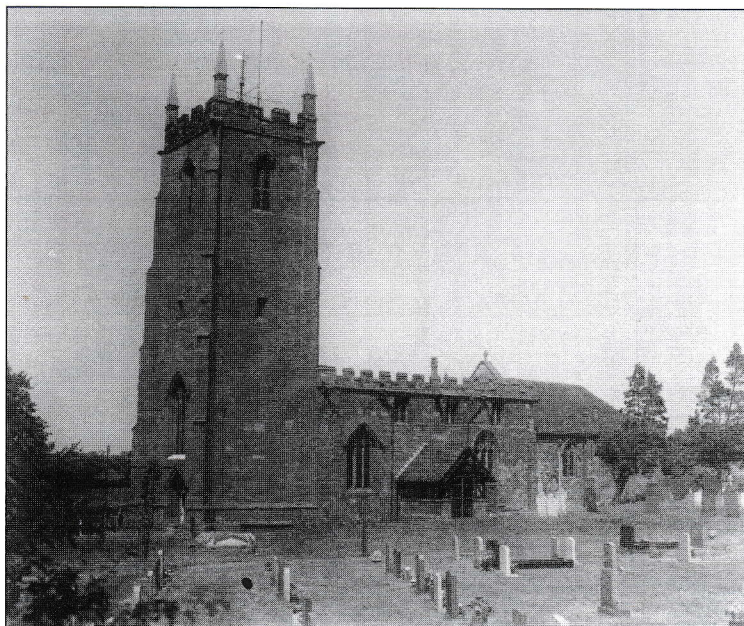

On Wednesday 29th February we will be clearing the wreaths and other items from the church yard ensuring that it will be easy for the grass cutter to cut round the grave stones. As there are over 700 gravestones in the churchyard, it is very important that we do not have any items/hazards on the graves, thus ensuring safety for all and the cost of maintenance does not become prohibitive.

At the same time we will also be checking that all the stones are safe and do not wobble. We would ask everyone who visits a loved one's grave to please ensure that it is safe and in good order, but if a problem is found please let the wardens know so that the problem can be resolved as easily as possible.

My daughter asked me recently when we were having some very inclement weather – “How did they dry the washing before Spin dryers, tumble dryers and radiators?” Well, my mother had her big mangle, an airer in the kitchen and she also put washing on the fire guard – which would now be thought very dangerous. However, she managed to wash and dry for 9 of us, she did my Grandma's washing and even washed for neighbours who were ill and couldn't do their own. She seemed to manage very well, but I hated Monday as this was washday, and it was an all day job.

I had to smile when I read my Bible notes for Christmas Eve. Solomon in Proverbs wrote 'Without oxen a stable stays clean, but you need a strong Ox for a large harvest. This also relates to – if you decide to have children you will have lots of joy, but lots of messes to clear up. Within seconds children can take a house that looks like it belongs in 'Better Homes and Gardens' and make it look like a trial run for the battle of Armageddon. This I can relate to, but the joy, fun and laughter is worth a little Hoovering and tidying up.

Researchers have found that 40% of the things we worry about never happen. Thirty percent are in the past and can't be helped. Twelve percent involve the affairs of others that are not even our business. Ten percent relate to sickness, real or imagined. That means only eight percent of the things we worry about are even likely to happen. Scientists at Yale University have actually identified a 'worry gene', but they say that while you may have inherited it, you can overcome it. Somebody said 'worry is just interest paid on trouble before it comes due'. And in most cases it never comes due.

Anyone who saw the moon at the beginning of January saw a sight to behold. Sometimes it looked like a yellow balloon hanging in the sky. The cycle of the moon means a full moon happens every 29 days which means on average there is one moon a month (originally, this word was moonth). So it was only natural to give each full moon a name associated with the natural world at that time of the year. January was called Wolf Moon and February Snow or Ice Moon.

There used to be many sayings connected with the weather and many people forecast by the season or the date eg. If Candlemass (2 February) be fair and bright, Winter will have another fight., If Candlemass Day brings cloud and rain, Winter will not come again. So let's see if this is true.
