

Our Dear Friends,

On Monday, May 24th, 1954 Sir Winston Churchill called a young man into the Cabinet room at 'Number 10' and asked, "Do you have any hope? What hope do you have for the world?" The Prime Minister pointed at the three early editions of the London Evening Newspaper lying on the empty table and spoke of how they were filled with rapes, murder and hate. "When I was a boy it was different. If there was a murder they would talk about it for months. Everything is changed now, so noisy, so voilent and the militant nation's menace to world peace grows all the time, I am an old man now without hope for the world."

The young man, who was Dr. Billy Graham, answered, "Mr. Prime Minister, I am filled with hope," Then spoke about Jesus Christ, turning from place to place in his New Testament, explaining the meaning of Christ's birth, His death, His resurrection and ascension and how a person is born again. Sir Winston had a great respect for the Bible which occasionally emerged in his writings. He also had a profound faith in a guiding Providence which he expressed vigorously to the nation in the worst moments of the war, "I do not see much hope for the future unless it is the hope that comes from a return to God," he said.

It is because of that certain hope that every year in the spring Christians celebrate Easter. This is one of the most important of our festivals. At this time we remember the last days on earth of the Lord Jesus Christ, He had many enemies who plotted to kill Him. They arrested Jesus and arranged a trial, He was accused of plotting to overthrow the Roman Government and claiming to be God, Writers in the Old Testament had prophesied about this event. They knew that because of our sin a sacrifice was needed before God could forgive us, This sacrifice had to be the life of a perfect man freely given up, Only Jesus could do this. They killed Him by nailing Him to a Cross and hanging Him from it. It was a slow, cruel death.

Early on the day we now call Easter Day Jesus came back from the dead—thus showing that God had accepted the sacrifice,

Because they met the living risen Jesus, at least 500 of them on one occasion, the lives of ordinary people were completely changed; and so it is today. That is the basis of the Christian hope for the world.

God give you a blessed Easter.
