THE NEW VICAR

By now most of us will have heard that at long last the new Vicarage is ready for human habitation and that a new Vicar has been appointed and he will take up his duties at a Service in the Church on Friday, May 15th at 7.30 p.m. This service will be taken by the new Bishop of Warwick, assisted by the Archdeacon of Coventry.

Here is the Official Announcement of his appointment:

"The Bishop, in consultation with the Church Patronage Trust (the Patrons of the Living of Ansley) has appointed the Reverend Timothy Maxwell Gouldstone, M.Sc., Assistant Curate at Ware, Herts. (Diocese of St. Albans) to be Priest-in-Charge of Ansley.

"Aged 35, Mr. Gouldstone is a native of Cambridge and was educated there at the Perse School. After working for a year for the Medical Research Council in Addenbrookes Hospital in Cambridge he went to Exeter University (1965-68) where he read Geology with Chemistry as a subsidiary subject. For the next six years he was employed as a mining geologist during which time he completed an M.Sc. degree by part-time research. In 1976 Mr. Gouldstone commenced his training for the ministry at Trinity College, Bristol and since his Ordination in 1978 has been at his present post in Ware.

"Mr. Gouldstone is married and he and his wife, Jane, have a baby daughter born on February 23rd this year. His wife is a nurse and they met at Bristol when she was Ward Sister at the Southmead Hospital.

"In common with many clergymen, Mr. Gouldstone has a love of railways (both model and the real thing) and he includes cycling and classical music among his leisure pursuits."

Mr. Gouldstone will be priest-in-charge for a short time (we hope) until the legal side of the Group Ministry with Arley, Fillongley and Corley has been completed. Then he will become Vicar of Ansley legally and completely. However from May 15th onwards we shall all call him "the Vicar" because to us all that is what he will be.

May God bless the Ministry of Mr. Gouldstone in the Parish of Ansley and may this new chapter in our long history be most beneficial to us all.
