Many thanks to all who came, to all who gave, and to all who helped. The Parish Church General Fund received £256.00 as a result of this good afternoon. Many thanks to everybody.

THE A.G.M. HELD ON MONDAY, MARCH 3rd, 1986

This was a good meeting although it was very poorly attended. It had been hoped that all those interested people would have attended but it was not so. The Church Officers were all duly re-elected and with one change the Church Council is the same.

Mr. D. A. Greenway was elected sidesman for the morning of the 2nd Sunday and Mr. Ian Richardson was elected sidesman for the 3rd Sunday evening.

To Mr. Fred Martin, who has relinquished his office as sidesman after many, many years of faithful service, we send our hearty thanks and hope that he may have many years of happy retirement. His service to his church has been a good example for us all to follow. Thank you Fred.

The Church General Fund Balance Sheet caused much discussion and much concern, it showed a deficit of £431.

The Church had spent a total of £8742, which is approximately £168 per week, which is a lot of money to find. Heating and lighting cost £1291 for the year and the Diocesan Quota to Coventry Headquarters was £3810. So it is easy to see where all the money we keep asking for goes.

The interest from the money realised on the sale of St. John's Church site goes towards the cost of the Sunday Church Bus and this year it helped with the repairs to the stonework of the Parish Church as well.

The Church income for the year came to £8311 which is nearly £900 up on last year. Without a Vicar for most of the year this is good, but not good enough, for we were £431 in the red. This means that on the average we received £150 a week but yet we need another £18 just to balance. A staggering thought that, but at the moment of going to press we are out of the red. The full Balance Sheet hangs in the Church Porch for all to see and will remain there until after Easter.

There are 125 names on the Church Electoral Roll and that has been hanging in the Church Porch but has now been removed to the Church Safe, for safe keeping. Please contact either of the Churchwardens if you wish to see it.
