

When you read this article I will have returned from Nigeria.

What it will be like, the challenges I will face and the excitements of our trip I can only guess at.

What I do know is that mid afternoon on Friday 15 March at the end of his visit to Coventry Rt. Revd.Justin Welby, Archbishop of Canterbury will pray for Bishop Christopher, for Marion McClennan (a lay person from Rugby with considerable experience of Africa) and myself as we prepare to fly to Nigeria.

We fly out on Friday night. On arrival there is a two hour drive on a good road from Abuja (the capital and the airport) to Kaduna. As I write we do not have the programme but I know Sunday will include worship that lasts about four hours and that most of the rest of the time will be spent visiting community projects, women's groups, rural development programmes and clergy meetings. We also know it will be hot and I'll probably be longing for the cooler weather of an English Spring! We fly back during the day on Wednesday 20th.

By the time you read this I will have gone and come back. I don't know what it will be like other than to say I believe it will be a transforming and wonderful time.

Perhaps the days before Easter is an appropriate occasion to be entering into something new with only a vague idea of what will happen. As Jesus walked resolutely to Jerusalem to his time of suffering and of death, all must have been incomprehensible to his disciples and the future totally uncertain. They heard Jesus talk of his resurrection but it made little sense - but we know he was raised from the dead and we rejoice.

Let us live our lives confident in the knowledge that Jesus rose again and that in all the uncertainties of life, He is victorious!

Ansley Village Church Hall

Since the Appeal was launched after the fire last November we have received £656.6s.0d., for which we are most grateful.

(The fire mentioned was in the roof of the nave next to the Norman Arch and the charred remains of one of the boss's is still in the gallery today – showing just how fortunate Ansley Church was not to have damaged more than the few square yards of the roof at that time.)

Did you know that 40% of girls born this year will live to 100 years old?
