## A FEW WORDS TO US FROM THE VICAR DESIGNATE

Jane, Rebecca and I are looking forward to our move to Ansley in May. As I write this, we are in the middle of preparations for Easter in Ware. There could be no more appropriate time of year to think over what it means to be a Christian today when so many think that God-talk is meaningless. Easter reminds us that Christianity is not for escapists or for those who happen to be religiously-minded. God is not interested in a little religious corner of this world but in all of it—so what sort of people does he want?

First, we need to be a **believing** church. 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.' Unless we know what we believe and why, we are not going to be much use to God or to his world. This does not mean that we are cocksure or arrogant. It does mean that we are assured about who God is, and what he has done for us.

Next, we need to be a caring church. 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' In the early days of the church all God's people shared in the work of the ministry. It wasn't left to the gallant few ! We need to ask ourselves — 'What is God calling me to do ?'

Lastly, we need to be a relevant and adapting church. That does not mean gimmicks or stunts to attract people. It means that our forms or worship, our social activities and the whole life of our church needs careful thought—what are our aims as the people of God and are we achieving them ?

Many thanks to the churchwardens and many others who are (not yet !) known to us who have kept the life and witness of the Christ's church in Ansley alive during the past two and a half years. We look forward eagerly to our move and getting to know 'who's who' in Ansley ! TIM GOULDSTONE

### THE LENT DISCUSSIONS

Much to everyone's surprise these were well attended and proved to be most interesting. It soon became obvious at the first meeting that those present wanted to talk about what the church was doing today and what they would like to see it doing tomorrow. Time and time again the question of young people playing an actual part in church life arose. Should the church provide facilities for activities organised by the young people themselves ? It soon became clear that everyone thought that besides being a believing church the church must also be a Caring-Church. Youth Club, Scouts, Brownies, Guides, visits, evenings spent together were all part of the discussion. So many ideas were brought up that it became obvious that more meetings were necessary before any real course of action can be taken.

Our visiting leaders were impressed when they realised that both Church Halls had activities which catered for the community as a whole and not just church members. Luncheon clubs, play groups and dancing clubs, etc., are open to everybody and are caring-organisations.

What happens now ? Much prayer and thought are now needed and then there should develop a pattern of church life which will be meaningful to everybody.
