

Our Dear Friends,

The first Sunday in Advent is on the last day of this month. The word 'advent' means arrival; or approach. The reference is, of course, to the coming of Jesus as a Baby. Hence the 'advent calendar' which leads up to Christmas Day.

In the service of Holy Communion we are reminded that we only need to remember the Lord's death **until He comes again**. During His absence when our eyes cannot see Him we tend to forget Him. However, that will not be so when we see Him at His second coming.

Christ's certain coming is a reminder that every person has an appointment with God for judgement at the great throne. It is there that every person will receive perfect justice. The severity of punishment will be determined by the degree to which he has sinned against the light that has been given him. Those who have never heard the Gospel but were sensitive to the voice of conscience will in the Lord's words, 'be beaten with few stripes' (Luke 12 48). While others who lived in gross wickedness, though knowing the truth or who rejected every opportunity of knowing, will be 'beaten with many stripes.'

In these days of instant replays when an audience can see whether or not a referee has made a correct decision, it isn't hard to visualise a high-speed review of one's life. How sobering is the prospect of having every word and deed, as well as every thought and motive, brought into full view. Dr. Francis Schaeffer, a Swiss theologian, said that at the last judgement it will be as if each person has a recorder built into his conscience registering every moral decision he had made. When God plays back the tape, the individual will hear what his conscience said to him in life: "It was wrong to tell that lie." "You should have helped that person." "You shouldn't have watched that immoral video." This record will be enough to convince the most self-righteous person that he deserves God's wraith. Everyone will acknowledge His sentence to be perfectly just.

The good news is that Jesus Christ died on the cross for us. Because He took our judgement at Calvary we can be set free from condemnation but only if we're willing to receive His forgiveness and commit our lives to His Service. So what we do with Christ here will determine what He will do with us in the hereafter.
