

THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND CHILDREN'S SOCIETY

Some fifteen years or so ago the Church Council, under the guidance of the then Vicar (Rev. S. R. Marriott), decided that it would do something worthwhile for this society. It appointed a secretary-cum-treasurer, who gave out collecting boxes and arranged for various functions to take place so that money could be sent to help with the work of the above society. It is concerned with children who have no parents and are alone in the world, children who need special care, because of their physical disabilities, and children who have lost the love of their parents often through no fault of their own. The Church Council still believes that this is a worthy cause needing your generous support.
