

We long that those who come through the door of our church will find not only a ready welcome but an opportunity to discover Jesus. May the door of our church be truly a door of faith.

But for now let us turn our thoughts to the great celebration of Christ's birth.

St Laurence's Tenth Christmas Tree Festival - Final Reminders

Trees will need to be placed in pots and moved into church on Monday 30th November.

Please help with this if you are fit enough for the task!

Decorating the trees will be on Wednesday 2nd and Thursday 3rd December from 2.00 p.m. to 8 p.m. Trees will need to be dismantled on Monday 28th December, from 9.00 a.m. It would be great if you could do this by 10.30, so that trees can be moved out and cleaning started. If you would prefer us to clear the tree, please let us know.

Visitors will be welcome during the three weekends before Christmas, from 11.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. on the Saturdays 5th, 12th and 19th December and from 11.30 a.m. to 6.00 p.m.

on the Sundays 6th, 13th and 20th December. There is an entry charge of £2.00 per person. Accompanied children under 12 have free entry. Proceeds are in aid of church funds with a donation of 15% to be given to the Mary Ann Evans Hospice.

A star bearing the name of a loved one may be placed on the Memory Tree near the pulpit and a candle lit for a donation of £1. This will go towards the cost of cutting the church yard grass, which at present is £260 for each cut.

You may like to peg a prayer to the Prayer Tree at the back of the church. Each prayer will be used in our intercessions.

Dedication of New Window

On All Saints Day, Sunday 1st November, the first new window at St. Laurence's since 1930 was dedicated to the glory of God. The window was given in memory of Jennifer

Woolliscroft. The inscription, written by her family, sums up so much of Jennifer's life and reads,

"In dedication to Jennifer Woolliscroft, who gave and received great support and love within this church from 1966 to 2012."

The window depicts the local countryside with its blue bells, pastures and woodland that she loved so much and that many appreciate today.

The window has been fitted into one of the oldest parts of the church in an opening which was lost from view for over two hundred years. The stone work was discovered in the early 1970s and a plain pane of glass fitted, bringing much needed light into quite a dark corner of the chancel. However this pane of glass had become cracked and very draughty. This lovely new window's design lets light stream into the chancel, as the bright sunlight did during the dedication.

It was lovely to welcome her large extended family to this very special service. We hope and pray it will continue to be enjoyed, giving light and glory to God for centuries to come.
