In his book 'God's Smuggler,' Brother Andrew relates an occasion when he arrived late one Saturday night in a place called Cluj in Romania; the year was 1968, and the next morning asked the hotel receptionist where he could find a church, The clerk looked at him suspiciously and told him, "We don't have many of those, and in any case you wouldn't understand the language."

That's O.K., said Brother Andrew, "Christians speak a kind of universal language," "What's that?" said the clerk, "Agape!" "Never heard of it," replied the clerk,

"Pity, it's the most beautiful language in the world."

The following Sunday, Brother Andrew met the minister of a Church in his office and was frustrated to find that neither he nor his secretary spoke a word of Andrew's languages, nor he theirs. Then Andrew saw that the minister had a well-worn Romanian Bible on his desk, so he took out his own Dutch Bible and turned to 1 Corinthians 16 v 20. 'All the brothers here send you greetings, Greet one another with a holy kiss,' He held out his Bible so that they could see the name of the book—recognisable in any language—and pointed out the chapter and verse. Their faces lit up as they found the same verse in the Romanian Bible and read it.

Then the minister thumbed through his Bible until he found Proverbs 25 v 25, 'Like cold water to a weary soul is good news from a distant land,' For half an hour they continued, laughing with tears of joy in their eyes as they searched for just the verses they needed.

That evening, as Andrew entered the hotel, the receptionist stopped him. "Say," he said, "I looked up that 'agape' in the dictionary. There's no language by that name, It's just a Greek word for love."

"Quite so," said Brother Andrew, "I was speaking in it all afternoon."

This 'agape' has been the driving force behind many people who live their lives, not selfishly but, sacrificially; giving their time, their intelligence, their gifts, their money, and some even their lives that others may become aware of God.

On the 28th of this month the Christian family throughout the world celebrates the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ, the greatest lover of all time; indeed it was He who introduced to our planet the 'agape' quality of sacrificial love. He had paid the price for sin, defeated Satan, and broken the power of that which we fear most; death itself,

Pray that God will give each of us something of His quality of sacrificial love in all our relationships with each other,

EASTER GREETINGS FROM CHILE

We arrived 22nd January, 1992 straight into a southern hemisphere summer with afternoon temperatures above 30°C almost every day. We are living near the centre of Santiago—capital city, not the best place to be when it gets hot! Home is a 7th floor apartment on quite a noisy route, Traffic seems to run 24 hours a day,

We praise God that there is a well equipped park close by where we go as often as we can with Luke. Occasionally we get to speak with some other parents at the park which is good for our language learning. Living in a busy capital city does not present itself as the ideal place for casual conversation encounters, but again we praise God that Chilean people are helpful, friendly and very patient. By the way, our Spanish is getting better, many thanks for all your prayers.

Many thanks also for all your cards, letters, presents and words of encouragement. So far we have replied to over 90 letters, etc. Please be patient if yours has not been answered yet. It will be!
